



Mastering Your Remote Video Setup and Performance

Initial Setup:

- Use Google Chrome or Firefox as default web browser
- Ensure you have a reliable internet connection; ethernet is preferable to Wi-Fi
- When prompted by your browser, allow access to your camera and microphone

Camera Setup:

- Your main light source should be in front of you; sunlight/natural light is best
- Set your camera at natural eye level or slightly above
- Position yourself an arm's reach away from the camera
- Give yourself headroom in the frame
- The simpler the background, the better
- Use a quiet, noise-controlled environment

Performance Tips:

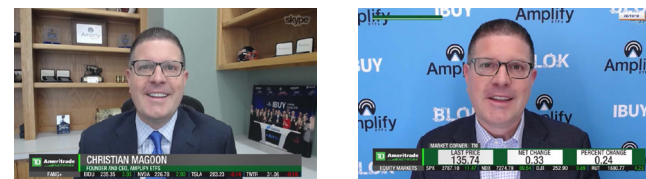
- Maintain eye contact with webcam to make viewers feel connected
- Close out of other apps/websites to limit distractions
- Speak loudly to show confidence
- Practice what you're going to say beforehand
- Record yourself and watch yourself back — it's the only way to get better!
- Avoid distracting clothing and accessories

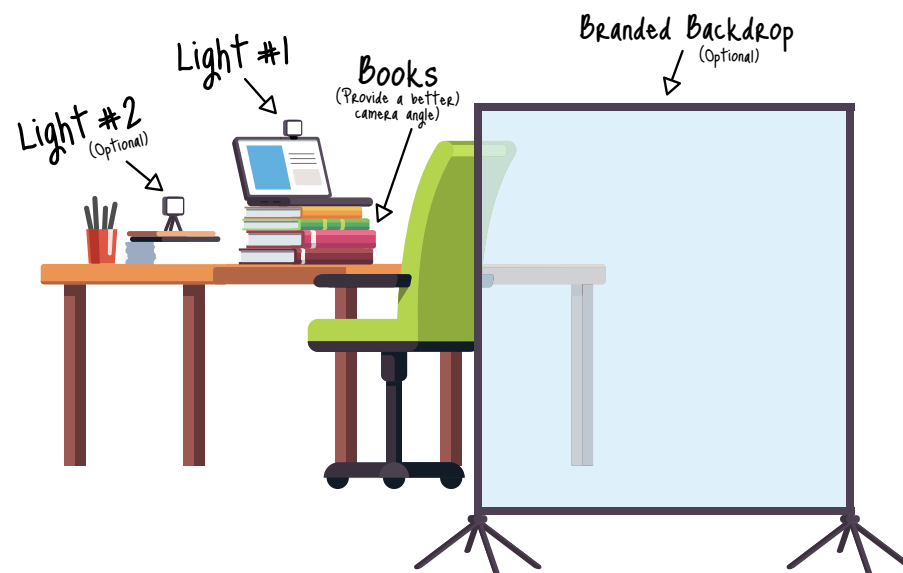

Backdrop & Lighting:

- Office setting or “step and repeat” branded backdrop



- Place light to the left or right of the camera
